#### Rabbi's Message



Dear Temple Oseh Shalom friends and family,

Shanah Tova! "What!" You are thinking, is he confused or using an old article from last Rosh Hashanah? No, we members of the Jewish community have not one, but two new years, and if you add the secular one, we have three! Of course, we have January 1, when the calendar changes the year notation, from 2023 to 2024 and so on. And we in the Jewish community have the religious new year that commences on the first day of Tishri, but Tishri is the seventh month of the Jewish calendar! The first month, the beginning of the year began just a couple of days ago, on the first day of the month of Nisan. Why is that the new year? Probably because it is springtime, in many ways the rebirth of the natural year, and it is significant to us because it is fifteen days before the Jewish holiday recognized and celebrated by more Jewish households (even more than Chanukah) than any other Jewish ritual day, and that, of course, is Passover.

Rabbis always know when Passover coincides with Easter, because those are the years when more churches call synagogues to request if the rabbis would celebrate a "mock seder" for the church, symbolizing for them, at least, Jesus and the Last Supper. Of course, if you read the description of the Last Supper in the New Testament, you will see that judging by the foods they eat at this meal, it couldn't be a Pesach seder

because they are "breaking bread," not crunching matzah! But this year is another coinciding of religious ritual, when the Muslim calendar also commemorates Ramadan at the same time as Pesach and Easter. How meaningful that these three great Biblical Abrahamic faiths are all awaiting their/our holy season at the same time. All three are symbolized with special meals and rituals, all symbolize the new beginnings, and all are profound moments in our respective religious calendars.

Toni and I look forward to being with fhose you have signed up for our Temple Oseh Shalom seder, a wonderful time of songs, stories, food delicacies, too much wine for some, and celebration for us all. Whether you will be with us or at homes with friends and family, I wish you a "Zeesen Pesach," a sweet and meaningful Passover, and a Shanah Tova!

Just two weeks later, On April 21st we will gather at the Lowcountry Church for our profound and poignant Shabbat/ Yom Hashoah service. With inspiring music, meaningful prayers and readings, the kindling of memorial candles, and most importantly, the opportunity to memorialize the loved ones of our TOS family who were lost in the Holocaust, it is an important service to remember and give thanks.
