Rabbi's Message

Dear Temple Oseh Shalom friends,

Since we won't be together in person until slightly after Chanukah, I want to share a little Chanukah ritual that we did with our children and now do with our grandchildren that I hope will be good for you!

Since we live in such a consumer-driven time, when far too much focus on Chanukah is gift getting rather than meaning giving, here is a Chanukah discussion theme for each night:

The First Night One light; Can you think of one thing you gave to someone else today? (a hug, a smile, a kind word, a helping hand?)

The Second Night Two lights: Can you think of two things that happened to you this week that were a "gift" from someone else? (some free time, a new thought, a new perspective or idea?)

The Third Night Three lights: We separate Shabbat from the rest of the week when there are three stars in the sky. How do you separate the holy things from the everyday? (special time, special place, special ritual, special stories?)

The Fourth Night Four lights: There are four seasons of the

year. Share a memory from each season that has passed since last Chanukah.

The Fifth Night Five lights: there are five books of torah, Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy. What is your favorite story in the Torah? (What is the most valuable lesson, what story has meant the most in your life?)

The Sixth Night Six lights: There are six days in the week on which we work. What did you give to the world through your work? What gifts of your soul did you bring to your work?

The Seventh Night Seven lights: there were three patriarchs (Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob) and four matriarchs (Sarah, Rebekah, Rachael, and Leah), our seven Biblical ancestors. What gifts or lessons came from your ancestors? How far back can you remember?

The Eighth Night Eight lights: There are eight nights on which we celebrate the miracle of Chanukah, Share your favorite moments from this Chanukah season. How can you make each holiday celebration more meaningful?

Even in this very difficult time, this is a moment to give thanks for the miracles in our lives and contemplate how we can be that miracle for others. Devotedly,
