Rabbi's Message

Dear Temple Oseh Shalom family and friends,

We all know the Jewish tradition of the minyan, or quorum, required to conduct a worship service. In our Orthodox tradition, it must be ten men for the minyan. In the Reform and many Conservative synagogues, there are ten individuals, regardless of gender. You might know that if you only have nine people, you can count the Sefer Torah as the tenth for the minyan. In other words, Judaism recognizes the essential importance of community, where everyone is important to make our worship possible.

You know that you are essential—every one of you. Whether you help with the Oneg Shabbat goodies at services or led worship at Parris Island, collect mittens and shoes for those in need, or bring canned goods for the Food Bank, you are vital for the life of Temple Oseh Shalom and the Bluffton community. You are the deeply loyal and generous individuals who give of your time and skills in the many committees of the congregation, from Ritual or Adult Education, Membership to Social, Care and Bereavement to the “Shofar,” who rehearse and sing in the choir or help make things run—from filling oil in the Shabbat candles to holding the “Shehechyanu Chuppah,” greeting at the front desk and guarding prayerbooks, ushering at services to leading the Board. 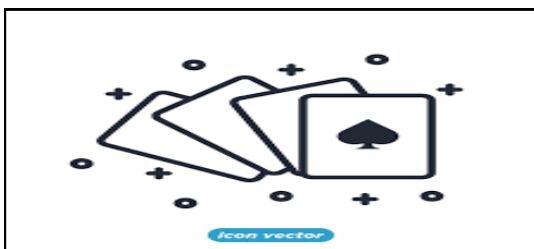

Adult Education

The Adult Education Committee has two program offerings for February on Zoom. On Tuesday, February 13th, in conjunction with Mickve Israel, Stuart Blickstein will begin his 5-part series on Kabbalah. This presentation will provide an introduction to and history of Kabbalah. There will be 2 presentations on Kabbalah topics in February and March, and one in April. The second February presentation on February 27th, will discuss the nature of G-d and creation. Subsequent topics are mysticism, magic, and miracles; meditation, and exploring and decoding hidden knowledge. Please watch for flyers announcing these presentations and sign up for those of interest. All presentations run from 6:30-8 pm on Zoom.

The second offering will be on February 22nd by Larry Rosendorf, who will talk about the 1936 Berlin Summer Olympics, also known as the "Nazi Olympics". The current movie, "Boys in the Boat", showed the US junior varsity team from the University of Washington winning the rowing competition in that Olympics, and Jesse Owens also won 4 gold medals. Larry will discuss the contentious treatment of Jewish, Black, and Korean athletes, among other topics in this not-to-miss presentation. Flyers with the Zoom link will be coming in your email.

Participants sought: The Adult Education Committee is planning to host a panel discussion by the children of Holocaust survivors, called 2G, for second generation. If you grew up with one or more Holocaust survivors as parents, please contact Karen Blickstein or Joel Biterman, who are putting together this program.

The committee would also like to continue the "This is your Life" series of presentations by Temple members who have unusual or interesting life histories with Judaism. Last year we had a very interesting and well attended presentation by Emma Avital, as the first presenter in this series. Please contact Helene Stoller with interest.

Film Club : Join us on Sunday, Feb 11, 2024 at 2PM in the Fellowship Hall of the Church for our next film, "Zelig." The NY Times wrote, "Uproariously funny! A cinematic marvel " ; Newsweek called it, "Pure magic "

Nominated for 2 Oscars in 1983. The story depicts Leonard Zelig, a social quick change artist with neurotic insecurity, who mimics and joins any group he is with. While very funny, the film has some serious implications as to why people join groups in their search for acceptance.

BOOK CLUB: Yes, as they say, we are alive and well and growing. We are not just your old Book Club; we have expanded (our themes). The past theme has been about Holocaust survival and deservedly so, especially with the parallel to our current world stage.

We are including and adding any book that has a major or minor Jewish theme. With so many choices what are we to do? Come join us to find out We meet the second Thursday of every other month at 11 a.m.

In January we had a lively discussion of THE ONLY WOMAN IN THE ROOM, about Hedy Lamarr, who was not only beautiful, but brilliant, facilitated by Jan Mintz. The conversation wrapped around from Hedy to our current world situation and our individual Judaism..

Our next meeting is on March 14th at 11 am. The book is SHADOWS OF BERLIN by David R. Gillham and will be presented by Karen Blickstein, whose address is 9 Columbus Circle. The story is set in NY in the 1950s with a background in Berlin. It is a story of revival and redemption and the way we learn to love and forgive.

On May 9th Marilyn Scheier will discuss THE COLOR OF WATER by James McBride. It is the true story of a black man's tribute to his Jewish white mother. You will be amazed.

Even though a person might have a good social network, they still might need our services but don't want to ask, so please let us know.

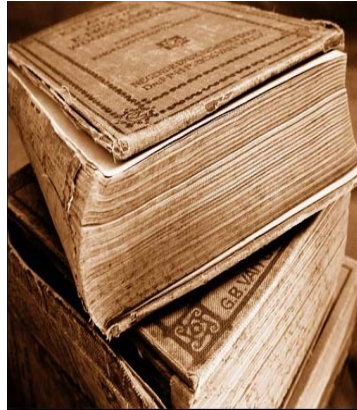
