

Rabbi's Message



Dear Temple Oseh Shalom friends and family,

We have watched with horror and deep sadness the tragic events in Israel in the past two days. Hundreds of deaths, thousands of injuries, untold damage, and profound sadness. We join with scores of Jewish, national, and international leaders and organizations, in seeking an end to the violence, praying for the safety of Israel's citizens, young and old, and holding all of them in our hearts, as we mourn for those whose lives were ended in these last days.

It strikes me as profound that our most recent Reform Advocate journal should have been dedicated to the subject of Zionism and Reform, from numerous centuries and perspectives. In a time such as this, while the profound and very difficult political challenges remain, we are united in our support of Israel's citizens, the brave men and women of the Israel Defense Force, the hundreds of students from around the world studying in Israel, and especially, we seek the immediate return of the hundreds of Israelis now held hostage.

If you have been following the numerous postings of rabbis, lay leaders, and Jews around the world, you will have read these words from Psalm 29, "May God give strength unto God's people, and may God bless God's people with peace." Those words could never be more immediate or meaningful.

Rabbi's Message (cont'd)

How meaningful it was to share our service of dedication to Israel and memorial for the tragic events of a fortnight ago, as we watched with horror when thousands of people were killed; innocent children and fragile elderly, young revelers at a concert celebrating peace, and hundreds of young soldiers defending their communities and country. Thousands more injured in battle, hundreds kidnapped, and millions around the world suffering pain, grief, and sorrow, even among our Temple Oseh Shalom family, with family and friends who live in Israel, some of whom are now in uniform serving their country, and all of us who love Israel.

I know that all of us are deeply worried about our loved ones who have been touched by pain and grief these days and weeks. We have several of our Temple Oseh Shalom family who arrived in Israel on that very day, October 7th, for what proved to be the shortest trip to Israel, ever. We are glad they were able to get home safely, and I hope they will be able to reschedule that much anticipated trip.

We are all deeply saddened and horrified at the events of the past two weeks, and we look ahead with concern about the days and weeks to come. There are no words to describe our anger at the deeds of Hamas. Jews taken into the streets to be tortured and beaten, hostages paraded in the streets of Gaza. It shows the incredible inhumanity of what humans who hate others are willing to do to other human beings.

One of my colleagues and friends in the Temple bulletin from Congregation Micah, in Nashville, reminded me of a story which I share with you. At the beginning of the Talmud, the 38 volumes of Jewish law written around 200 CE, in the first section, Berachot (Blessings), we find a very peculiar question, "What is God's prayer?" The Rabbis of the Talmud answer that God prays, " May my mercy overcome My anger." No person is completely merciful or fully angry, or completely kind. We can't make the angry parts disappear, but we can try to make the good and loving parts grow.

May our mercy prove stronger than our anger, our kindness stronger than our cruelty, and our love stronger than our hate. Devotedly,

To Rabbi Kanter and the members and friends of Temple Oseh Shalom,

My heart and those of the congregation were surely broken by the horrendous, brutal terrorist attacks and appalled at the senseless loss of life of innocent people. I understand that many of you have relatives and connections in Israel and can't imagine the fear you feel and the concern you have for their safety. I am sorry too that the targeting of Israel as a nation is making you feel targeted as Jews even this country. No one should have to live in fear for their safety, or for their very life.

I join with you in praying for a cease fire and pray for a peaceful resolution so that more lives aren't lost, both Israeli and Palestinian. I pray that leaders in surrounding countries have the wisdom to do what they can to deescalate tensions so that there isn't more loss of life.

I also pray that aid will be able to flow into Gaza to avert what is already becoming a humanitarian disaster with the suffering of hundreds of thousands of people who have no where to go and no food and water.

I pray for healing for all in both lands who have been victims of the violence, whether from a bullet, a bomb or a rocket, and especially for the children who will bear the scars of what they've seen and heard and experienced. I pray for God's deep comfort for all those who grieve the loss of a loved one and for those who will experience such devastation in the days and weeks to come.

How it must grieve God's heart when those created in God's image inflict such pain upon one another. Even as we feel helpless as we watch events unfolding, may such violence make us all more resolute to be peace makers in our own homes and community, so that ultimately all can live free of fear and oppression, so that all might know God's shalom.

This month, the Tikkun Olam committee is again holding it's "Mittens" project. They are looking for new items only – mittens, coats, hats, scarves, etc. These are presented as holiday gifts, so they must be new. Thanks to Deena Chontow for organizing this again. By the way, Deena is still looking for a few committee members. Please give her a call.

There are volunteers who have stepped up to help. Jan Mintz and Marilyn Scheier will be co-chairing the Book Club; Janet Orange will coordinate meals for the Rabbi; Larry Rosendorf will be starting the Movie Club once we can get into the Fellowship Hall. Dan Geller is our new House Chair, and he is looking for a couple of people to back him up. Please contact Dan if you can help. It's not a difficult job! We are still looking for someone to learn what Rhoda Rubin, our administrator, does. Rhoda says that most months, it's less than 10 hours per week. If we don't find someone within our Congregation to do this, we'll have to hire someone. Rhoda's work is very integral to our organization.

The Care Committee performs many mitzvot in our Congregation. 


