Rabbi's Message



Dear Temple Oseh Shalom family and friends,

I bet the last thing you want these days is another message from me! So don't worry, this won't be another sermon, but rather a continuation of my Yom Kippur service on "words," specifically words of "Thank you." Our Jewish calendar helps us with this, as on October 15, we will give thanks for the Harvest with the Festival of Sukkot, the biblical holiday of Thanksgiving. As we wave the lulav and etrog, these symbols represent our thanks for the harvest of all plants and climates, the etrog (citron) for citrus, the palm for deserts, the willow for marshes, and the myrtle for other lands. With our Sukkah, we give thanks to nature and our crops.

But this article is more a thank you for our now completed High Holy Days. Scores of people were involved in making them the meaningful and beautiful services that they were. President's Message

Dear TOS family,

We can only continue to grow with your involvement. We have to think about the future, and I would encourage everyone to ask themselves: What am I willing to do for Temple Oseh Shalom? How much of myself am I willing to share? Sometimes the smallest thing can mean so much. I'm reminded of a very famous Hillel quote, which I'm sure you know: "If I am not for myself, who will be for me? If I am not for others, what am I? And if not now, when?"

There are so many Congregants that work in the background to keep us functioning well, which is wonderful. We do, however, have some positions to fill. They are as follows:

- 1) We need a House Chair – this position requires being sure everything is set up correctly for our services. If anyone is interested, please contact me and I'll detail what's involved. It's not a "time-consuming" occupation.
- 2) We need an Education Co-chair. Helene Stoller is willing to co-chair it if we find someone to work with her. Thank you, Helene.
- 3) Janet Cargotch moved away so we have no one to lead the Book Club. The September meeting was the last one unless someone shows an interest in taking over.
- 4) We need a co-chair for the Social Committee. Cindi Walton is willing to stay on as co-chair, but she needs a partner.
- 5) The Tikkun Olam Committee, headed by Deena Chontow needs some help. This Committee has two fund raisers per year: one for winter clothing, coming up at this November's Shabbat service; and our shoe donation during Yom Hashoah. Please contact Deena to offer your help.
- 6) Al Richter is always looking for more participants to help at Parris Island which is an amazing Mitzvah. Don't hesitate to contact him.

In my President's message in May, I spoke of building redundancies in our systems. We were able to replace what Bill Altman had done for a long time with Jeff Overman, Toni Valenstein and Donna Lewis. We are grateful for their help. We now need to find an assistant for Rhoda Rubin. Rhoda's been our Administrator since the beginning and will remain so but what she does is critical to us so we must have a backup. It requires knowledge of Word

and Excel. It also requires someone who is discreet, has great people skills and is detail oriented.

Please contact any Board member or me if you are willing to help us out with these important functions. We look forward to hearing from you soon.

Even though a person might have a good social network, they still might need our services but don't want to ask, so please let us know.

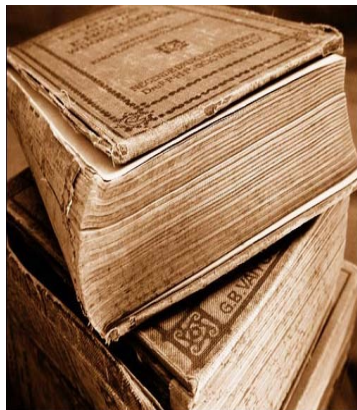
We also provide the Mi Shebeirach list read at services .
